Remote Learning 2020/21 Action Plan

In September 2020, all our classes returned to full-time education following the Covid-19 closure in March. Although we hope that the majority of our children will now have an uninterrupted experience, there is the possibility that an individual child, a class bubble, or indeed the whole school will need to self-isolate for a period of time. We have therefore put in place a plan for remote learning so that all children can continue with their education.

If a child does not have access to a computer/laptop and/or the internet, the school will do all it can to support children and will provide paper packs of learning. Where funding can be accessed, remote devices (e.g. laptops) and/or 4G connections will be sought, particularly for disadvantaged children. Parents will be reminded to make the school aware of any barriers to accessing remote learning.

You will find here an overview of lessons to be completed each day on your child's Seesaw account. It will provide learning across the curriculum and children will be expected to spend a similar amount of time completing this as they would spend learning in school.

<u>The Overview</u> (provision in event of whole bubble or school closure, NB live or recorded lessons will not be provided if majority of children are being taught on site)

The timetable will include:

- Maths 5 lessons weekly planned by the class teacher, using White Rose Maths with pre-recorded videos.
- Guided Reading 2 live lessons weekly with follow up activities planned by the class teacher related to the class text and 1 comprehension a week.
- Project Based Learning 3 lessons weekly planned by the class teacher from a variety of cross-curricular subjects.
- Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar (SPAG) 5 lessons weekly planned by the class teacher
- Religion 2 lessons weekly planned by the class teacher using the Margaret Carswell resources
- PE/Dance/Art/Italian 1 lesson per subject weekly planned for by specialist teachers 1 of these lessons will be presented live with class teacher

- 1 live collective worship will be shared with the children using the Children's Liturgy and/or planned by class teacher.
- 1 PBL learning lesson or 1 RE lesson will also be taught live depending on the week.

Support with Remote Learning

Class teachers will endeavour to provide age-appropriate activities that the majority of the children should be able to access with minimal support from adults at home. If the children require support with their learning, class teachers will be available on Seesaw throughout the school day to provide further assistance.

<u>Seesaw</u>

The 'teaching content' will be provided to children through age-appropriate video content, visual resources and activities set by their class teacher, linked to the curriculum for their year group. Where possible, this will be a continuation of the learning that has taken place within the classroom as part of their project.

Providing Feedback

Pupils can send any completed work to teachers via their Seesaw accounts and feedback will be given, where appropriate. Alternatively, work that children complete on paper can be photographed and uploaded.

Contact with Pupils/Parents

Parents are able to contact the school via telephone, direct Seesaw message and the school admin email address: <u>office@stvincents.barnet.sch.uk</u>

Teachers will respond with feedback if required. Any response should be made within 48 hours. Where a pupil is selfisolating on medical grounds for a significant period of time, contact will be made via telephone on a weekly basis to monitor learning and provide support if needed.

When accessing personal data, all staff members will only use their official school email account and connect to the school network using their school laptop only.

Sharing Personal Data

Keeping Devices Secure

All staff will take appropriate steps to ensure their devices remain secure. Computers should be locked if left inactive for a period of time. Operating systems must be up to date – always install the latest updates.
